## 2021 HOLLER CABERNET SAUVIGNON

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The 2021 Holler attacks with a uniquely complex nose of black cherry, forest floor, toasted oak, vanilla and mineral. This all leads to a richly textured palate loaded with blueberries, black currants, earthy goodness, dark chocolate and sweet herbs, all swaddled in extra fine tannins. As always, the World's Best Cabernet Sauvignon For the Money.

**Food pairing:** Steak and baked potato, old school like. Or roasted mushrooms and mashers.

**Movie pairing:** *To Kill a Mockingbird*

### FOUNDERS' NOTES:

First produced in 2012, **Holler** is named for Red Hollow, a place where Chris's parents once lived in Knoxville, Tennessee. The theory behind the wine is simple: once the barrels for Stella Mae, Kingpin, Rainmaker and Evermore are selected, the remaining barrels become **Holler**. These barrels are good enough to become the #21 and #29 wines on *Wine Spectator's* Top 100 Wines in the World. At \$35...

**Appellation** Columbia Valley

**Aging** 40% new oak, French, Eastern European and American, 18 months
