TASTING NOTE

Aromas of citrus blossom lead to notes of gooseberry and pink grapefruit. Bright acid leads to a crisp, clean finish with lingering minerality. Pair with a fresh summer salad, butter-sage pasta, goat cheese, and seared scallops.

VINTAGE NOTE

The 2022 harvest had a slow start in Washington due to an unusually wet and snowy spring. Despite a few days with temperatures breaking 100°F, temperatures across the state tended to stay within the optimal ripening zone throughout the summer months. While autumnal rain falls further delayed the completion of harvest until late November, fruit was plentiful. The white and rosé varietals from this 2022 vintage have shown lovely aromatics and acid.

VINEYARDS
